Solutions that empower one caregiver to do more, safely.

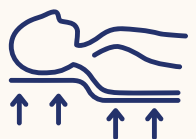

From the Ground: Trial Experience



During a recent trial at an elderly care home with an automated lateral turner system, care teams shared that:

- Residents were more comfortable with smoother, gentle turns.
- Caregivers experienced lesser physical strain.
- Turning tasks became more manageable during night shifts.
- Time saved allowed more focus on other important aspects of care.
